Another great volume, I can't get enough of Saiyuki! Goku is one scary monkey in this volume! It's always surprising, since he's the most immature and childlike of the four protagonists, but he really seems to be the strongest. Friendship also seemed to be a big theme in this book - Goku's vicious defense of Sanzo, Sanzo reluctantly realizing that he cares about Goku, Gojyo's concern for Hakkai, Gojyo comforting Goku (in his own violent, insulting way, of course), just to name a few instances. Then, of course, at the end, when Gojyo denies that the other three are his friends, his words have the consequence of the other three being injured by an unknown extent, by a strange new adversary, as the book ends in a cliff hanger.
