In the book, "Coming Attractions", Katie Weldon is a senior ready to graduate college, with no idea what she will do after graduation. She experiences conflict within herself, and with others such as her friend Rick, Eli, and her parents. Katie has self vs self conflict with deciding some things. She also has character vs character conflict with her parents and Rick.

Katie Weldon experiences self vs self conflict in this story. She is trying to decide what to do with her life after college. One example of something she has a conflict with, is whether she should date Rick or not. She doesn't know if he is too organized and punctual for her, or if he really is the right one. Katie doesn't know if she should go to Africa or not. She has self to self conflict when she is trying to decide to help er good friend, Eli, raise money for water in Africa, or if she should stay back home. She has to decide if she should invite her parents to her graduation. This is conflict because she has no relationship with her parents and they live far away, but Katie decides to invite them, even though they didn't really care about her. Although she did experience some self to self conflict, Katie sorted through her problems and made the best decisions for herself.

Katie also experiences character vs character conflict. She gets angry at people very quickly. An example would be when Rick, her boyfriend, asked her about her inheritance, and she ended up breaking up with him that night.
