It's a fine story that moves along at a good pace. The trouble is that there is only the one pace. The heroine never really falters. While there are some obstacles, they are surmounted easily. There were early attempts at exploring ideas around free will and compliance, but all that potential resolved itself without the heroine's active involvement; the issue just sort of evaporated. Which seems like a loss because that could have been a good discussion. Overall it felt very even.

There is also trouble with the way a lot of sci-fi war stories treat battles. This one also falls into the same difficulty of imagining technically advanced combat. It comes off as a straight transposition from the classic view of war from the late 1900s. It utilizes similar techniques and strategies that seem unnecessary with the technology of the world. But a lot of action sci-fi fails to change the way battle is experienced for a very different sort of technologically equipped world.

Her debt is recalled, she is sold to a group of mercenaries and immediately finds herself in the middle of another war.
