It is quite satisfying to see layers upon layers of plot come together and frankly quite surprising for a manga initially plotted as a harem, a concept gradually put to one side (though never fully abandoned) in favor of building the bonds of companionship between Negi and his allies.

There is serious character growth and the fact that the antagonist (Chao) is, to me at least, an unlikable fanatic, while her intentions are essentially good, is a show of great forethought on Akamatsu's part.
