As far as vampire books go, this wasn't all that original, all though, the beginning was promising. The way the story progressed was kind of disappointing because the Vraiden, Luc and Eris stories were clichéd and I was expecting the plot to go another way. Still, the book is pretty easy to get through because it's quite short. Enough happens to keep you interested. Adelyn was a good protagonist mostly, and I liked that she stood up for herself when Vraiden was being a jerk. Speaking of him, I really hated him. The romance was a letdown. Adelyn and Vraiden fall in love for no reason, I didn't see the chemistry, and nearly have sex the first time they actually have a proper conversation. There aren't any big negatives in the book other than what I mentioned, but there aren't a lot of unpredictable twists either. I was given a copy of this book in exchange for my honest review, and I will say the book is not without it's flaws, but I enjoyed it.

Immediately from Chapter 1, Gilbert has a unique style of writing simple - a quick read that's easy to breeze through - yet her descriptions make sure readers see every single detail of the scene, but not in a way that slows down the pace or bogs down the story.

And what I thought was going to be a typical paranormal romance ended up being a bit more as readers are thrown into the politics surrounding the Black family, the rivalry between the brothers, some cool actions scenes, as well as a few unexpected twists, although I confess, I'm still not sure how I feel about the last chapter (see below).

What got me with this story was the chemistry between the main characters, and I didn't mean in the romantic sense because included was the relationship between the two brothers. This book stirred so much emotions from me, whether it was swoony moments or frustration at the characters.

Adelin was a feisty character who had a spunk to her and doesn't take crap from anyone. I will say, though, that there were a few times that I wanted to yell at her, "What the hell is your problem?" like how standoffish she was when she first met V even though she did not know him at all or the way she treated Lucien.

Vraiden is quite something else. Who wouldn't want to be the girl who turns the hot, bad boy into a sweet romantic, who has more than just a few moments that just make you melt. But for me, the kicker was Lucien, who has so many layers to him, from his damaged past to his protective loyalty for those he cares about. Luc is one of those characters where you have a feeling the author would never write the girl to end up with (like Puck in The Iron Fey or David in Laurel), but he has such a well written personality that you can't help but root for him.

But like I said, I'm not sure how I feel about the last chapter, but I do know that it did not sit 100 percent well with me. (view spoiler) Of course, I may be biased because of who I prefer in this book.

First to explain the rating: I did not hate the book (which I reserve 1 star ratings for) nor did I think it was okay (which is 2 stars). It just wasn't good. The book is fairly short and I really think the plot suffered because of it. The characters weren't developed, the places weren't described well, and nothing was resolved. In the beginning of the book, we are introduced to several characters who initially appear to be important. For example, Bryn the best friend. Yet a few pages after being introduced to these characters, they are never heard from again. I had really hoped that Bryn would have made more of an appearance since she is, after all, the best friend. But all she gets is one little scene and then she disappears completely from the story with not even a little phone conversation to tie her back in. The conversations between characters were, for me, the unrealistic conversations that make you roll your eyes in disbelief. I'd be lying if I said I didn't skim most of the dialogue.

Next comes the romance. I couldn't keep up with it half the time! They like each other one second, the next they hate each other, then they are back to making out, then they want to kill each other, and so it goes. All in one or two paragraphs. I guess that just isn't really my kind of love story.

I think the overall idea of the book was decent, but the execution was really lacking. But that could just be because I'm not a huge fan of the genre. I wouldn't recommend it, but it also isn't on my "avoid at all costs" list.

This is the story of Adelin, an 19 year old girl who has grown up as a single child with her single father, having lost her mother just after being born. She grew up knowing that she may contract her mother's 'fatal condition' at some point and has undergone routine medical tests to see if the illness starts to make itself present in her own body. Adelin is a cool girl. As characters go, I like her. She's intelligent and not whiny or incapable. She is put in some difficult situations and has to make some tough decisions she reacts in ways that are understandable to the reader (or at least to me!) One day she receives a visit from her doctor and it's news that she never wanted or expected. The good news - it's not fatal, her life is not necessarily in danger -- just life as she knows it.

Adelin soon takes a trip to a private island where she becomes acquainted with a group of immortals, including her own mother, who she learns is still alive. She has to use her time to decide if she wants to become one of them herself and really get to have the mother she thought she'd never get to know, or if she want's to stay human and live her ordinary life with her father.

While Adelin is living on Black Island she get's to know the family providing it's namesake. Moira Black (who is somewhat of an immortal queen) and her husband Elrich have to have two very good-looking sons; Vraiden and Lucien. Both of them definitely have serious appeal. The relationship between them is full of

skeletons in the closet.

The first time we are introduced to Vraiden in the story, I immediately thought to myself, SOCIOPATH!! If that is what the author was going for on a first impression then I think she hit the nail right on the head. I know that he's not human and therefore might not be classified as such from his own peers, but being on the human side of the line myself, I will go ahead and defend my snap judgement of him for at least a little while. :) Many of the details that we learn as a reader are not known to Adelin as she gets to know him, he does tell her that he's done some bad things but does not give all the scary details. Adelin is not fully human when she meets him so he presents no imminent danger to her, so I can see why not being a victim to his murderous ways helped her to see his finer qualities and feel an immediate attraction to him. After all... he is very attractive!

Lucien or Luc is much more sympathetic to the human cause. I had a much better immediate reaction to him. He takes time to really help Adelin understand the origins of the Immortal race and how they came to be. I really enjoyed this part of the story's legend, it was kind of scary.

While I have pointed out the faults of one character and the strengths of another, it's not as easy as black and white. There is not one brother who is all good and one who is all bad. Adelin is kept by safe by the efforts of both brothers. I don't want to comment further on the plot because I feel I would be giving too much away if I did. I will say that the author did a great job of creating one idea for these characters and then turning those ideas inside out by adding twists and turns in the plot. I am left thinking about these characters and their choices long after closing the book.

Origins is an imaginative and enjoyable read. The world and plot are fresh and original. I will eagerly anticipate future writings from this author. As it stands now, I don't know how long I can hold out for the next book in the trilogy after the last words of the last chapter.
