Kate Douglas continues the story of the Chanku in this fifth Wolf Tales book. Here, two more women are added into the mix, Manda and Millie. Manda has been living alone and avoiding the world because she is stuck in the transitional stage between woman and wolf, and unable to make the transition to fully be one or the other. Scarred from the cruel treatment she has endured in her past, she fears being around others, not knowing how they will treat her. The Chanku pack finds out about her when they see her picture in a tabloid magazine. Baylor Quinn, feeling lost without a mate of his own, takes it upon himself to seek Manda out in hopes of helping her.

While Baylor is off on his "mission", Ulrich Mason is off on one of his own. Anton Cheval has requested that he seek out a woman by the name of Millie West, who he believes is Chanku, and help her make the transition to wolf. He thinks that Ulrich is the only one to do it and that this could possibly be a new mate for him. Can Ulrich finally move past his wife's death and take a new mate?

Baylor and Manda are a very strong couple and Baylor's help, which allows her to "turn" fully to Chanku, makes one of the best transition stories throughout the series so far. I loved the way Baylor explained everything to her and how she was so shy and naive. It was like he was talking to a child the whole time rather than a grown woman. I will admit to being a little confused with this story at the start. There is actually two stories going on at the

same time and frankly that left me a little lost at first. Eventually I saw how they tied together and I thought it was sweet. As for the two romances paralleling, they were pretty good. Not a lot of issues other than just meeting, getting to know each other and falling in love. That seemed to happen rather fast but Eh, its a book. The sex scenes are super naughty and not for newbies. If you like some explicit erotica then this is your series.

This story has plenty of graphic G/G and M/M sexual exploits as well as threesomes and foursomes. There is nothing light about Kate Douglas' erotica, there is really nothing left to the imagination. If this is what you are seeking then you have found an entertaining series.

I continue to be fascinated by the uses of legend to accomplish the standard romance-novel purposes. Here, the wolves-mate-for-life thing still provides that opportunity, but the writer adds swinging, gay sex, lesbian sex, threesomes, and foursomes as well, because they're wild animals, right? I like that inclusion, without batting an eye, of alternative lifestyles, although it's too bad that there has to be the "animal libido" excuse for them. But do they all have to be gorgeous in human form just because they're werewolves?

The writing quality is high compared to most other romance novels, and I also liked the parallelism of aspects of the two stories; as a result, I suspected the book's major revelation before it was even suggested. The extra "crisis" thrown in at the end seemed hasty and unnecessary, and it didn't fit the more confident sense of self that the characters get after mating allows them full access to their mates' thoughts. (Maybe that's why they look so gorgeous on the outside too. Attitude is 90% of appearance, I think.) It's cool to think how much more sure of ourselves we'd be if we could really get an unfettered look inside someone else's head at his/her impressions of each of us -- but it could be heartbreaking too! I'm not sure I'd want to know my husband's full and honest opinions of me about everything, nor would I want him to know mine of him. Don't these people ever want a little space?? No acknowledgment of that here. It's still a romance novel, so I guess these folks aren't ever critical of or angry with one another.

What this book does explore are the effects on sex of the mind link that wolves in the same pack are supposed to share. That mind link is there in other werewolf fiction but not taken to its obvious conclusion. Now that would be great -- you'd know exactly what you're doing right and wrong and what your partner wants without having to be told, and you'd get to experience both your own and your partner's feelings of the act at the same time.

But this book has a LOT of sex. Once it gets started, it recurs constantly throughout the book. If that's what you want, then this book is for you. It did get just a bit old for me though.

I am very angry at this publisher. I've read five books in this series now - Wolf Tales 1 through 5, and I only just realized that Douglas' other series - Sexy Beast - is part of the Wolf Tales series. You are supposed to read Wolf Tales 1 then Sexy Beast 1, then Wolf Tales 2, then Sexy Beast 2, etc. I am so angry! No wonder I've been confused so many times with this series. I just finished 5 and then immediately picked up 6 only to discover that I missed a HUGE part of the story that was teased at the end of book 5. So I looked it up on Kate Douglas' website and am now very annoyed. They should have made it clear that it's really just one series and numbered them in order.

Not that anyone reads this series for the story - it you read it, it's because you are entertained by werewolves and like extremely imaginative erotica-including 3 and 4-somes. This book features Millie and Ulrich getting together, as well as Baylor and Manda. I remember Millie from book 4 and Ulrich from several books, but I thought I was just forgetful about Baylor. Now I wonder if he was introduced in one of the Sexy Beast books. Manda is a new character. She was caught mid-shift as a teen and then captured and brutally studied for the next 20 years.
